

Resolution of the Council of the Faculty of Economics, University of Gdańsk concerning the principles allowing the student entry into the subsequent semester from the academic year 2014/2015 on Economics and International Economic Relations fields of study

Resolution no. 46/14/WEUG  
of the Council of the Faculty of Economics  
of June 26, 2014

The Council of the Faculty of Economics, acting in accordance with § 20 section 1-3 of the Study Regulations of the University of Gdańsk, sets as follows:

§ 1

The faculty council sets the maximum ECTS points deficit as well as the maximum cumulative ECTS points deficit in one semester, allowing the student entry into the subsequent semester.

§ 2

Maximum ECTS points deficit in one semester for Economics and International Economic Relations fields of study, as described in § 1, is 12 ECTS points.

Maximum cumulative ECTS points deficit for Economics and International Economic Relations fields of study, as described in § 1, is 20 ECTS points.

§ 3

The student is obliged to obtain credit for subjects concerning ECTS points deficit in the next examination period, in which in accordance with the program of studies, including the plan of studies, these subjects can be passed.

§ 4

The resolution comes into force on October 1, 2014.
