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INTRODUCTION

Times New Roman character font 12 pt, text aligned, line spacing 1.5, paragraph indentation 1.25 cm, lack of additional spacing between paragraphs, margins: top and bottom – 2.5 cm, right and left – 3 cm. Page numbers at the bottom, centered. All lists – automatic. Superscript numbers – number in the text before punctuation marks (before full stop, before colon), text of footnote: *Times New Roman* character font 10, line spacing 1.0 pt.

The introduction should contain¹:

- justification of the selected subject (why is it worth researching the given issue, what will it contribute to the existing knowledge),
- the objective of the thesis,
- research hypothesis (in Master's theses),
- the scope of research and the period of time covered by the research,
- description of the structure of the thesis (how many chapters it has and what is each chapter about),
- indication of applied research methods and characteristics of resources used in the thesis.

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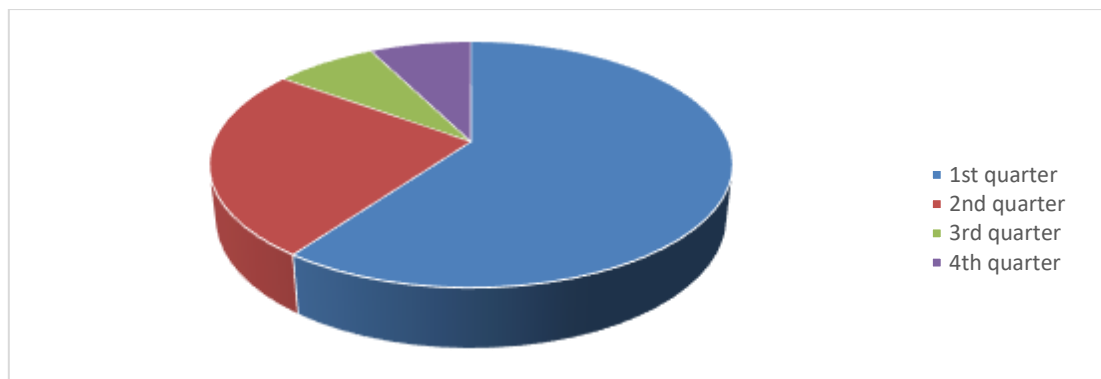


Fig. 1 Figure's title
